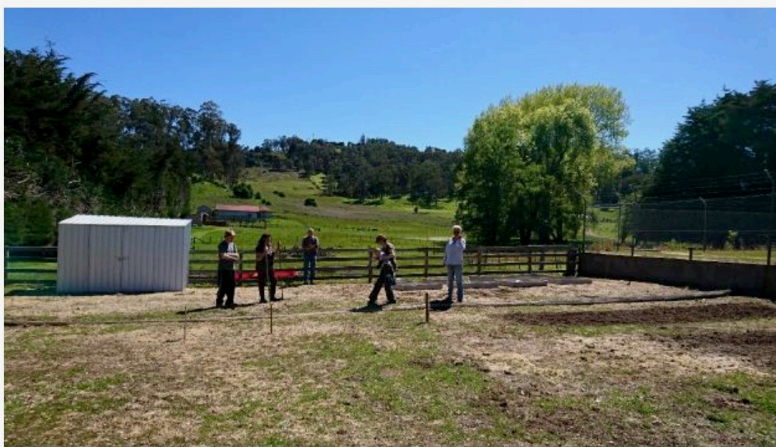

Mole Creek Community Garden

The Mole Creek Garden was first established in 2017. It has rapidly grown into a vibrant space. It has been a collaborative project between Deloraine House, the Mole Creek Progress Association and the Mole Creek Primary School.

From the initial community engagement, identifying the user group needs, and the construction phase, with in-kind buy in from the

Mole Creek community, this project has been a fabulous success, and due to its location, and the people involved has become a self-sustaining project.



In the last reporting period, we had 28 garden volunteers/users not including the students from the Mole Creek Primary School.



A grant was recently secured, through Relationships Tasmania, to build a library/pantry out the front of the garden and a pizza oven within the garden for communal garden gatherings.
